

Darrell Green is best known as a former cornerback with the Washington Redskins. During his record-setting 20 year career with the team he came to be known and lovingly referred to as "Mr. Redskin." His on field accomplishments include two Super Bowl victories, seven selections to the Pro Bowl, and four NFL Fastest Man competitions. In 1991, he was the World's Fastest Athlete and even at the age of 40, Green ran the 40-yard dash in 4.2 seconds. In 2010, he ran a 4.4 40 on his 50th birthday. He has received a number of awards, including the NFL's most prestigious Man of the Year award in 1996. In 2008, he was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in his first year of eligibility.

Darrell Green met his wife of 29 years, Jewell in Washington, DC where she was born and raised. Jewell owns and operates Posh Couture, a highly popular online fashion boutique. The couple have three children who are all successful in their own right. Jerrell is a graduate of James Madison University and is a third year at the Loyola University New Orleans College of Law. She also serves as the Director of Communications and Customer Relations at WalkfitHealth Nation. Jared Green is a graduate of the University of Virginia where he met his wife Joanna Green. After three years playing in the National Football League, Jared retired to become a full-time pastor at Grace Covenant Church in Virginia. Joanna is currently the Executive Administrator of Darrell Green Enterprises. Their youngest, Joi, is the Founder and CEO of MiniLeague, a mothers concierge service.

Darrell Green is also well known for his work off the field. As a proponent of education, service and moral development, he founded The Darrell Green Youth Life Foundation (DGYLEF) in 1988 and continues to oversee its operations. The DGYLEF provides a wide-range of academic development and values-based education programs through Youth Life Learning Centers (YLLC) operating in select urban, suburban, and rural neighborhoods. The first centers were established in 1993 in Northeast and Southeast Washington, D.C. and Upper Marlboro, Maryland. Each center equips youth to address obstacles they face while training them to provide quality leadership for their peers, family members, and their community. With affiliate centers in Richmond, VA, Nashville, TN, and Raleigh-Durham, North Carolina the centers vision continue to flourish. DGYLEF hosts an annual Christmas with the Redskins, a toy drive for more than 150 underprivileged communities throughout DC and Virginia. Children are sponsored by Redskins players, staff, and individuals from the community by purchasing clothing items to present to the children the night of the party. Lastly, the foundation founded Darrell Green Business Council for Youth in which 10 students a month from the DMV/Maryland/Northern Virginia area have the opportunity to have lunch with CEOs of local businesses. All of the students are eligible for a scholarship at the end of the school year.

In 2000, President Bush appointed Green Chairman of the President's Council on Service and Civic Participation. Green also sits on the Board of Directors for MainStreet Bank and the Greater Washington Sports Alliance, as well as the Advisory Board for Every Child Fed. Lastly, In 2013 Green was appointed Special Assistant to the athletic director for student athlete development and public relations at the University of Mary Washington

As an avid businessmen, Green owns and operates several businesses. In 1997, he established Darrell Green Enterprises, Inc., a marketing company that facilitates opportunities for Green and

In 2000, Green created Darrell Green Holdings, LLC to manage his business interests which include Intekras, a SBA-certified 8(a) company offering integrated solutions in three primary disciplines: Information Security, National Security and Defense Systems; Trusted Solutions Group, a hub zone company that specializes in providing training and workforce development solutions to government and industry; and WalkFitHealth a web-based corporate wellness company that provides employer's a complete menu of solutions to support their employee's in their quest to achieve optimum health and fitness in the work place.

Green completed his Bachelor of Science degree in social science at St. Paul's College in Lawrenceville, Virginia. In 1999, Marymount University recognized him for his extraordinary humanitarian endeavors and conferred upon him the honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters degree. In 2002, George Washington University and St. Paul's College awarded Green his second and third honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters degrees.
