

Cruth Curach is the result of *Craftitecture*, a design competition run by the Crafts Council of Ireland and the Irish Architecture Foundation to celebrate Year of Craft 2011 on the island of Ireland. This pavilion is a collaboration between Bucholz McEvoy Architects and master boat builder, Jim Horgan. Constructed using the form of currachs, it will move on horizontal and vertical axes to form an open space when in use and a sculptural form when closed. Cruth Curach makes its debut at *Electric Picnic* as part of *Global Green*. Na Piobairí Uilleann (NPU), the Society of Uilleann Pipers, was founded in 1968 at grassroots level by pipers with the aim of protecting a threatened art form. Now, forty three years later, NPU is a thriving arts organisation with thousands of members, dedicated to servicing the aims and needs of uilleann pipers worldwide. www.pipers.ie

Master boat builders **Jim and Conall Horgan** continue the family tradition of boat building that goes back to the 1950s in Youghal. They have built over 200 traditional wooden boats, ranging from 24' Galway Hookers (*An Muirin*), Scandinavian/Irish Yawls, sailing currachs, beach boats and tenders, and the restoration of many old hookers including the 42' *Cliona na Toinne*. www.galwaysschoolofboatbuilding.com

In 2010 she took up a two-month artist in residency programme with the Kilkenny County Council Arts office, which saw her develop a new body of work collaborating with a group of local knitters.
